MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

Mental Health First Aid is a FREE workshop designed to teach the signs and symptoms of common mental health conditions and how to respond and refer.

To date, Mental Health First Aid has trained 266 individuals with a five-step action plan to help others experiencing a mental health crisis.
